LEGISLATION & GUIDANCE

This policy guided by the following advice from the Department for Education (DfE):

- School Admission Appeals Code

St Cuthbert's is its own Admissions authority and all admissions are under the control of the Governing Board. Consequently the school sets its own admissions criteria which are based upon the direction from Salford Diocese and taking into account Rochdale Local Authority practices.

St Cuthbert's 11-16 Roman Catholic High School serves the contributory parishes and associated primary schools listed and aims to provide a place for every Catholic child from these areas who seeks a Catholic education.

St Cuthbert's RC High School has been established to serve the parishes and partnership schools of St John's, Sacred Heart, St Patrick's, St Gabriel's, St Vincent de Paul's, Holy Family, Rochdale and St Mary's Littleborough.

The target admission figure for 2024-2025 is 210.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Most students will apply in year 6 for a place in year 7 via the Local Authority. Places will then be allocated by the LA based upon parental choice and the rank order of criteria outlined in this document. There are further details available on the school website.

If there is a situation resulting in over-subscription then tie-breaker admission will be decided by the safest shortest walking route, as determined by the central point of the home to the main entrance gate of the school. All applications for school places are completed via the LA either using the RMBC website or collecting a form from a relevant LA office. Applications must be completed before the end of October in the year preceding the child starting at St Cuthbert's. Details on places will be sent to parents in March of the year before the child starts.

Students looking to transfer in year to St Cuthbert's can get application forms for places on-online at RMBC website or on request from Rochdale Local Authority. They should be returned to the Local Authority in as soon as possible.
