
The Future


Fundraising

The assembly has been followed up with lessons in every subject area on some of the significant black figures in history linked to specific subjects throughout the month.


We have also had an art competition running throughout the month with some wonderful contributions from our students and these will be judged by our Year 11 student leaders and a prize awarded.
