Support and Guidance

At St. Cuthbert's we are committed to keeping your child safe whether that be with us in school, online or out in the wider community. Parental support plays a vital part in a child's education, so we work closely with parents and carers to ensure strong links between students, school and home. A good level of communication with parents is essential. We welcome parental input through our newly-established parental forum, whilst enjoying the opportunity to meet parents both within formal and informal events. Our dedicated school-based safeguarding team work with students and their families to provide universal support in the form of parenting support workshops, advice, signposting, onward referrals, meetings in school and home visits.

We are immensely proud of the inclusive education and care that we offer at St. Cuthbert's. Staff are committed to offering a wide range of activities and opportunities that extend beyond the classroom setting, supporting the needs and interests of all students. This may include counselling, workshops such as raising self-esteem and anger management or support returning to school following illness or long term absence.

Pastoral Care

At St. Cuthbert's we pride ourselves on the excellent quality of our pastoral care. All staff are committed to supporting and caring for our students to ensure they are safe, happy and successful. We have an excellent pastoral system with Form Tutors being a focus in our partnership with parents. Each student is assigned a Form Tutor who sees the student every morning and is a consistent point of contact, taking responsibility for the student's pastoral wellbeing.

Good behaviour, attendance and achievement are recognised through our rewards system. We regularly celebrate students who make progress within their subjects and live out our values across all areas of our school and the wider community.

A culture of respect is actively promoted in our school. Our anti-bullying policy establishes the right for every child to feel safe and confident, making it clear that any deliberate behaviour that upsets or distresses another student will not be tolerated.

At St. Cuthbert's, we have a wide range of supportive initiatives and interventions available to any student who may need this at any point during their high school journey. Our Wellbeing Officer, SENDCo, Safeguarding Team and Pastoral Team work closely to ensure that this is of upmost importance when working with our students and their families.

We are committed to preparing our students to become healthy, responsible and mature young people of the future. We equip our students with the skills they need to become role models for all. Our students are positive role models who are actively involved in, and consulted with, regarding all key aspects of their learning.

Growing in Faith

At St. Cuthbert's, students are given every opportunity to grow spiritually. Students are invited to pray daily, attend Mass regularly, take part in religious retreats and become GIFT Chaplains, who work with local and global charities. All of these opportunities allow each student to become spiritually aware, well-rounded individuals.

Sacrament of Confirmation at St. Cuthbert's

The Sacrament of Confirmation strengthens the gifts received in Baptism through the further gift of the Holy Spirit and prepares us for the mission of Christian life. Within Year 8 at St. Cuthbert's, all Baptised Catholics will have the opportunity to take part in the Sacrament of Confirmation. This is an important part of their spiritual journey and we work in partnership with our local parish churches to complete a programme of in-school and in-church sessions.

Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education

Our spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) education permeates throughout our curriculum. This plays a significant role in ensuring our students are safe, happy and successful.

Achievement and Success

All of our students have gifts and talents that we always look to develop and celebrate at St. Cuthbert's. We recognise that it's not just in the classroom where achievement flourishes, but also across school and beyond. As well as offering substantial extracurricular activities and enrichment opportunities, our school community regularly comes together to recognise and reward students for all they achieve and the positive contributions they make to our school and wider community.

Whether it is student praise and rewards from staff through the use of ClassCharts achievement points, or it is the collective acknowledgement gained within our termly year group reward assemblies, staff at St. Cuthbert's strive to recognise the hard work, commitment and dedication our students demonstrate on a daily basis.

Additional Needs

Our SEND team ensure that all students' individual learning needs are catered for. The specialist, knowledgeable and experienced team work alongside students, parents, carers, staff and other stakeholders to ensure that all students can achieve their potential. Pre- arranged transition visits allow our staff to understand the needs of each individual before they start at St. Cuthbert's. Parents, Carers and students are also given the opportunity to share their views prior to their child moving to high the school. This collaboration ensures that the students have a personalised pupil passport so that staff can best meet and support their individual needs within lessons.

Experienced staff support learning in the classroom, deliver personalised intervention programmes and promote positive attitudes and behaviour. Allocated areas within school also allow students the chance to access activities and socialise in a quiet, supportive environment during their break-time and lunch-time. Curriculum

Rooted in the teachings of Jesus Christ and His Church, the curriculum at St. Cuthbert's provides ambitious educational opportunities for all members of our community. The curriculum equips our students with the knowledge, skills and personal characteristics to flourish as global citizens bringing about the common good.

Key Stage 3

Key Stage 3 marks the start of an exciting journey for students as they embark on a pathway designed to enrich students' ambition, love of learning and equip them with the skills, cultural capital and powerful knowledge they need to lead happy and successful lives. Students study a broad and balanced curriculum to allow them the opportunity to thrive and flourish in all subject areas. Students follow a core curriculum of: Religious Education, English, Mathematics, Science, Geography, History, a Modern Foreign Language, Art, Drama, Music, Food Technology, Design Technology, Computer Science, Skills for Life and P.E. fulfilling the National Curriculum requirements in an innovative and engaging classroom environment. This is further enriched by a personal development programme which endeavours to build independence, resilience and confidence in students.

Key Stage 4

Students in Year 10 have the opportunity to personalise their own curriculum pathway and we offer a wide range of courses allowing students to follow the route most appropriate to their needs, interests or future career path. All students follow a core curriculum of Religious Education, English Literature and Language, Mathematics and Humanities. Students then have the opportunity to choose from a wide range of GCSE and vocational qualifications including Art, Business Studies ,Computer Science, Drama, Food and Nutrition, Health and Social Care, Music, a Modern Foreign Language, PE, Psychology, Sociology and Sports Studies. In addition to their assessed curriculum students' physical, personal and social education continues in Skills for Life and Physical Education. During this key Stage we aim to enrich our students' experience by offering regular study and intervention sessions, careers education and a range of extra-curricular activities so they leave school as well qualified, self-regulated and confident young adults who are ready to make a positive contribution to their community and wider society.

Extra-Curricular

St. Cuthbert's RC High School prides itself on upholding the dignity and worth of all children within school, therefore the enrichment programme aims to develop an ethos of belonging to "Our School" and developing students' cultural capital and character education. Our enrichment programme aims to help students to develop their interests and abilities, provide valuable learning experiences outside their academic studies and promote independence and interpersonal links with students in other years. The enrichment programme has been designed to support students develop the essential skills they will need to progress onto higher education and employment. Our enrichment programme offers a wide range of activities across our school including opportunities within our Core subjects, Sports and PE, Performing Arts, Technology, Computer Science and so much more.

Transition

At St. Cuthbert's we have a dedicated team of transition staff including members of the Senior Leadership Team, Pastoral Staff and Support Staff, who work closely with students on their journey from primary to secondary school. We endeavour to make this transition as smooth and efficient as possible, by providing a wide range of transition activities. Consequently, Year 6 students will feel more confident about their move to secondary school.

In the summer term of Year 6, students joining St. Cuthbert's are invited to attend a number of different events such as a Transition Day where they enjoy lessons, meet their teachers and make new friends. We hold additional induction opportunities for students who may need a little more support, including those with additional needs. Such opportunities include a Friendship morning for those students coming from primary schools with smaller numbers.

Parents and Carers are also invited to attend an Information Evening, to meet staff, including their child's Form Tutor, and ask any questions that they may have. There will also be information available on how Parents and Carers can best support their child at secondary school.
